"I am the person about who data has been collected and stored. I have certain rights under the Data Protection Act. Any company who uses data about me must make sure that my data is up-to-date, stored safely and only used for the correct purposes"

"I am the number of principles in the Data Protection Act. I clearly state how data should be collected, stored, maintained and used"
